

## Let's HELP Rebuild Yangpachen!



Yangpachen monastery called Dhechen "The Great Bliss" was formally founded, blessed and consecrated by the 4th Shamarpa, Chennga Choekyi Drakpa in the eleventh century. Dhechen has since then, served as principal seat from the enlightened dharma activity and spiritual legacy of all the Shamar incarnations and, which have spread and flourish in Tibet, China, Nepal and Bhutan. Unfortunately during the Cultural Revolution in 1959 and along with aged-old, most of well treasured objects of the Buddha's representations were severely destroyed. Under the auspice and spiritual direction of the present Shamar Rinpoche and dedicated lamas, have jointly undertook a drastic reforms with action plan to rebuild and restore the monastery. In 2001, Kunzig Shamar Rinpoche built a monastic institute of higher Buddhist studies for young talented lamas and facilitates them with modern Buddhist science and the learning of traditional contemplative studies. Now the monastery has entered to the final phase of the overall development both physically and spiritually with newly initiated 21 Taras according to Atisha's tradition and eight emanations of Guru Rinpoche statues still in the making. These statues are gold plated bronze metal casted in Lhokha Tibet.

The cost and size of the statues are as follows:

- (1) Each Tara(x21) measuring 47 inches or 120cm - USD \$3000 or Renminbi-18,700.
- (2) Each Guru Rinpoche(x8) same size with Tara - USD \$3600 or Rinminbi-21,600.
